A new strain of Parvovirus has been seriously affecting dogs in Michigan and surrounding areas. Dogs will show initial signs of lethargy, loss of appetite, fever, and as the virus progresses, vomiting and bloody stools. If you notice any of these signs, bring your dog to your vet. Parvo is highly contagious and without treatment is deadly, mostly affecting puppies with weaker immune systems and unvaccinated dogs. The problem with this new strain of the virus is that initially, dogs have been testing negative with early symptoms, but later testing positive. To contain the virus, MI vets have been offering free vaccination clinics. At the moment, there are no large outbreaks on the East coast, but it is good to be aware.

Closer to home, two Glastonbury dogs were bitten by a Timber rattlesnake in their back yard. Luckily for the dogs, the owner saw the snake and that the dogs had been bitten. They were rushed to Pieper Memorial, which has anti-venom on hand, and were treated. According to DEEP, Connecticut only has two venomous snakes, the Copperhead and Timber rattlesnake. These dogs were lucky they survived. Their normal vet did not have the anti-venom as it is very costly and does not have a long shelf life.
